
## Year 1 Weekly News Round-up

Another exciting and productive week has flown by in Year One, marking the successful completion of week 5 and the first half of the 2024 term! Despite the inevitable fatigue that comes with hard work, our students have remained diligent and enthusiastic throughout. We're thrilled to highlight some of the standout moments from this week.

During our English lessons, the children have demonstrated remarkable creativity by reimagining and modifying the narrative of "Lost and Found" to craft their own unique versions. Throughout the week, they diligently transcribed their narratives into their notebooks and also had the opportunity to publish their stories on special publishing paper. We've been thoroughly impressed by the depth of their creativity and the richness of their imagination showcased in these stories. In our Maths lessons the children have been honing their skills in comparing numbers ranging from 1 to 20. We delved into the concepts of greater than, less than, and equal to, emphasizing the importance of using this language accurately. Additionally, the children practiced correctly identifying and applying the comparison symbols while solving more complex word problems, allowing them to deepen their understanding of numerical relationships.

A standout experience this week was our participation in the Big Birdwatch! The children thoroughly enjoyed their trip to Jubilee Park, where they eagerly searched for various bird species. We spotted some colorful parakeets during our observations, adding an extra layer of delight to the outing.

This week presented additional learning opportunities across various subjects. In Geography, the children delved into the intricacies of rural areas, gaining insights into their characteristics and significance. In Art, they showcased their creativity by painting clay animals, infusing life and color into their creations. Additionally, in Religious Education, they explored the timeless story of Jonathan and David, uncovering its deeper meanings and relevance to their studies.






