Learning this week

Year 2 have had a fantastic week full of learning!

They have become super scientists, our topic is living things and their habitats. To begin with we discussed things that are living now, non-living and other things that used to be living. Using the acronym MRS GREN, the children were able to identify things that are living and non-living. We also spoke about characteristics that both plants and animals have in common as well as their differences. The children also answered big questions such as 'How would you classify a leaf that is still attached to a tree but is losing its colour?'


It has been another splendid week of Maths learning as we continue our learning of place value. This week we were challenged to show how we can partition a two digit number in multiple different ways! The children first represented the numbers using dienes, then split the tens to help them use other numbers. They were amazing! Constantly demonstrating great presentation, showing us all that they take pride in their learning.

This week in English, went deeper in our understanding of Little Red Riding Hood, they made links to other stories such as the 3 Little Pigs and showed great inference skills! We then began generating vocabulary to describe the wolf by thinking about his appearance and personality and how we can best convey that to the reader. The result was the children producing some brilliant characterisations of the Big Bad Wolf!

The beauty of wolves also featured in our Art lessons this week. The children used their knowledge of pencil tone to make some amazing drawings. They looked closely at photographs of a wolf and worked really hard to add the details in.

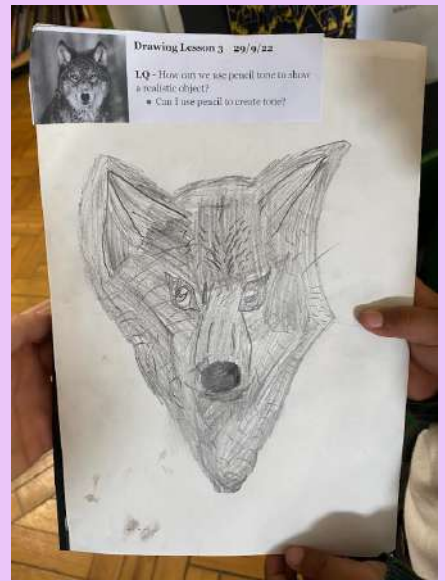
