## Learning this week

As another week ends, the Year 4 team would like to say a huge well done to all of the pupils for their continued hard work and focus.

Continuing our study of this term's text, The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe, we deepened our knowledge of literary devices and writing skills to start creating imaginative sentences to use in our final creative writing piece. We explored expanded noun phrases, fronted adverbials, and even started looking at similes, metaphors and personification!
Practicing partitioning of numbers up to 10,000 has been our focus in Maths this week, using pictorial representations and partitioning models to support us with our understanding.

In the wider curriculum, Year 4 looked at the lives of six different monarchs throughout history: Mansa Musa, Queen Elizabeth II, William the Conqueror, Richard the Lionheart, King Henry VIII and Marie Antoinette.
